Energy Saving Tips:



Heating and cooling costs make up nearly 50% of your annual energy costs. Small changes to your thermostat can add big savings to your home's heating and cooling costs. Use the following tips this summer to stay cool and save electricity:

In the summer, keep your thermostat at 78°. Set it higher when you're away all day. Each additional degree below 78° adds about 3% to your energy costs.

If you use a window air conditioner, seal all cracks and open areas around the unit. Check the filter regularly and clean or replace the filter when needed.

Use fans instead of, or in addition to, air condition-

Weather strip your doors, caulk cracks in the door frames and replace worn or ill-fitting thresholds.

Avoid using appliances such as the washing machine, dryer and dishwasher during peak electric usage times (between 7am and 5pm). Daytime hours have the highest demand for electricity, so wait until the evening hours, when temperatures are lower, to run energy-guzzling appliances.

Bi-Weekly Recycling Schedule





The City of Laurinburg collects residential curbside recyclable materials on a bi-weekly collection schedule. Each residence is assigned to either the GREEN or RED recycling route. This determines which week recyclables are collected according to the schedule below.

The recyclables will still be collected on the same day of the week as garbage. For example, if garbage collection day is on Monday, then recyclables collection will be every other Monday.

The City of Laurinburg now collects all the following items in the curbside recycling program:

Newspaper; Aluminum Cans; Steel Cans; All plastics with #1 - #7 on bottom (does not include styrofoam);

Magazines; Mixed office and computer paper; Corrugated Cardboard; Clear, Brown, and Green glass bottles; Used Oil (secured in a plastic bottle with a tight cap)

Other Solid Waste Collection Schedules:

<u>Corrugated cardboard</u> is collected <u>every other week</u> along with other recyclables. Please flatten your cardboard boxes and place inside or next to your recycling bin on your scheduled recycling collection day.

<u>Yard Waste</u> is collected <u>as often as possible</u> with a goal of one pickup per week. It is not assigned to any particular day as the trucks just get as far as they can each day. <u>Please separate all yard waste into two separate piles</u>, one containing limbs, shrubbery clippings, and/or pine cones, and the other containing leaves and/or grass clippings.

<u>Bulky Items</u> are collected weekly on the <u>same day of the week as household garbage</u>. Please place your bulky items at the curb on the same day that you place your roll-out cart at the curb for collection. Bulky items includes all large trash items that can't fit in your cart, such as furniture, white goods (appliances), television sets, large toys such as bicycles and swing sets, lawn equipment, and used tires. The City does <u>not</u> collect building materials resulting from construction, demolition, remodeling, or repair work.

Bulky items may <u>not</u> be placed at the street for more than 24 hours prior to your scheduled collection day.
