Holiday Schedule



The City of Laurinburg offices will be closed Monday, January 16, 2023 in observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day. All solid waste and recycling routes for that Monday will be picked up on Tuesday, January 17, 2023.

The City of Laurinburg offices will be closed Friday, April 7, 2023 in observance of Good Friday. All solid waste routes for that Friday will be picked up on Thursday, April 6, 2023.



IMPORTANT NOTICE PLEASE READ BEFORE PLACING ITEMS CURBSIDE

The City of Laurinburg Sanitation Department is working hard to pick up all garbage and yard debris in a timely manner, but we need your help. Below are a few of our policies and guidelines that we need for everyone to adhere to. If our crews come to your area and see that your garbage or debris pile is not within our guidelines, we will leave the pile until the situation is resolved. If this happens, our crew will leave you a doorhanger to inform you as to why the debris was not removed. If you have any questions, please call our Public Works office at 910-276-2364. We are here to answer any questions you may have.

Please read this list and make sure you are within the guidelines so that we can service your address properly each time we are in the area.

- Separate all yard waste into 2 piles. One containing limbs, shrubbery clippings, and pinecones, and the other containing leaves, pine straw and grass clippings. Make sure piles are clear of litter and trash.
- Leaves and pine straw should be placed in 1 pile no wider than 6 feet.
- Limbs need to be 4 inches or less in diameter and 6 feet or less in length.
- Yard waste from tree removal will not be collected without an additional charge. This includes limbs, logs, stumps, and mulch. If you would like an estimate of charges, please call the Public Works office at 910-276-2364. We cannot give an exact quote because the fees are based on tonnage.
- Limbs cut by contractors or tree surgeons will not be collected without an additional charge.
- Do not put any yard waste in the road or in the curb. All yard waste should be placed behind the curb, so they don't clog up the gutters in the event of rain.
- Garbage and Recycle roll-out carts should be placed at the curb the night before your service day (or no later than 6am on your service day) and positioned with the handle side to the house.
- Do not place roll-out carts in the street.
- Place roll-out carts behind the curb and at least 3 feet from mailboxes, poles, trees, and other
 obstructions. Do not place roll-out cart near a parked car.
- Do not put yard waste in the roll-out carts.
- Blue Recycle Carts Only loose recyclable items are to be placed in the Blue Recycle Cart. Recyclable items are Plastic bottles/jugs (#1 #2), Steel and Aluminum cans, Glass bottles and jars, Newspaper and Corrugated Cardboard. Do not put these items in a bag.
- Recycling containers containing five (5) percent or more of garbage or non-recyclable items will result in a \$50 penalty or removal of cart.
- Bulky items only include furniture, white goods, lawn equipment, and large toys such as bicycles and dismantled swing sets and other large trash items that will not fit in a roll-out cart. They are to be placed beside the roll-out carts, behind the curb.
- The following items will not be collected without an additional charge:
 - Cut Trees & Cut Tree Debris
 - Building Materials
 - o Bricks or Concrete
 - Sand
 - Plywood
 - Boards
 - Drywall
 - Roofing Materials

- Plumbing materials (toilets, sinks, etc.)
- o Electrical Materials
- Carpet/Padding/Nail strips
- o Hazardous waste
- Any other waste from construction or demolition (doors)
