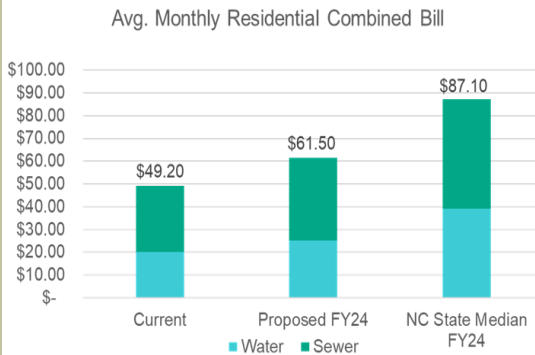
Message from our City Manager

As with other communities across the country, much of the water and sewer system we rely upon is aging and has reached or is approaching the end of its serviceable life. You've likely seen workers around town upgrading and replacing key elements, and much more is planned to keep our system reliable and resilient into the future.

City Council has diligently found creative ways to fund this work, which has kept the rates you pay much lower than what is charged in neighboring communities. While the City has not increased rates during the past eight years, City Council recently approved changes that will increase what you will pay for these valuable services.

These higher rates will enable the City to repay loans that are coming due and give us a better chance of securing low-interest loans or grants for future projects.

Starting July 1, the typical residential customer will see their combined water and sewer bill increase by around \$12.31 monthly. Even with these changes, Laurinburg's rates will remain below the regional average (see chart below).



We appreciate the community's support as the City weighed the changes, especially given our sensitivity to keeping all services affordable.

Bi-Weekly Recycling Schedule

2023-2024



The City of Laurinburg collects residential curbside recyclable materials on a bi-weekly collection schedule. Each residence is assigned to either the **GREEN** or **RED** recycling route. This determines which week recyclables are collected according to the schedule below.

The recyclables will still be collected on the same day of the week as garbage. For example, if garbage collection day is on Monday, then recyclables collection will be every other Monday.

The City of Laurinburg ONLY collects the following items in the curbside recycling program:

Plastic BOTTLES with #1 or #2 on bottom; Corrugated Cardboard (must be broken down); Aluminum Cans; Steel Cans; Clear, Brown, and Green glass bottles;
Used Motor Oil (secured in a plastic bottle with a tight cap and placed beside the recycling cart);
Used Cooking Oil (secured in a plastic bottle with a tight cap and placed beside the recycling cart)
